Do you need to see a doctor, a nurse practitioner, or a dentist but have no insurance? The doctors, dentists and nurses at Community Volunteers in Medicine can give you and your family these health care services if you qualify:

- **Health Education/Health Promotion Classes**
- **Physical Exams**
- **General Medicine**
- **Dental Care**
- **Pediatric Care**
- **Orthopedic Care**
- **Diabetes Management**
- **Drug Dispensing**
- **Smoking Cessation**

What Does It Cost?

Care is provided to those who are eligible. There are no charges, no bills sent to you and no insurance forms to fill out.

Who Can Receive Care?

You will need to meet with a counselor in order to determine your eligibility. We urge you to call us to see how we can help you, or if necessary, we can refer you to other community resources. Pay stubs are your insurance card at CVIM.

How Does It Benefit Our Community?

- Serves as a health education resource center.
- Improves the health and welfare of citizens in our neighborhoods.
- Keeps people in the workforce.
- Minimizes expensive hospital emergency room care.

Community Volunteers In Medicine is staffed by doctors, nurses, podiatrists, dentists, dental hygienists, social workers and pharmacists who are licensed in the state of Pennsylvania. We are volunteers, both clinical and non-clinical, who have been screened and invited to participate.

Eligibility Requirements

1. You must live or work in Chester County.
2. Your gross income must be at or below:

- Financial eligibility screening is performed every six months for patients that qualify for services. Care is funded through private donations.
